*When you're finished with the discussion, continue with the lesson.*

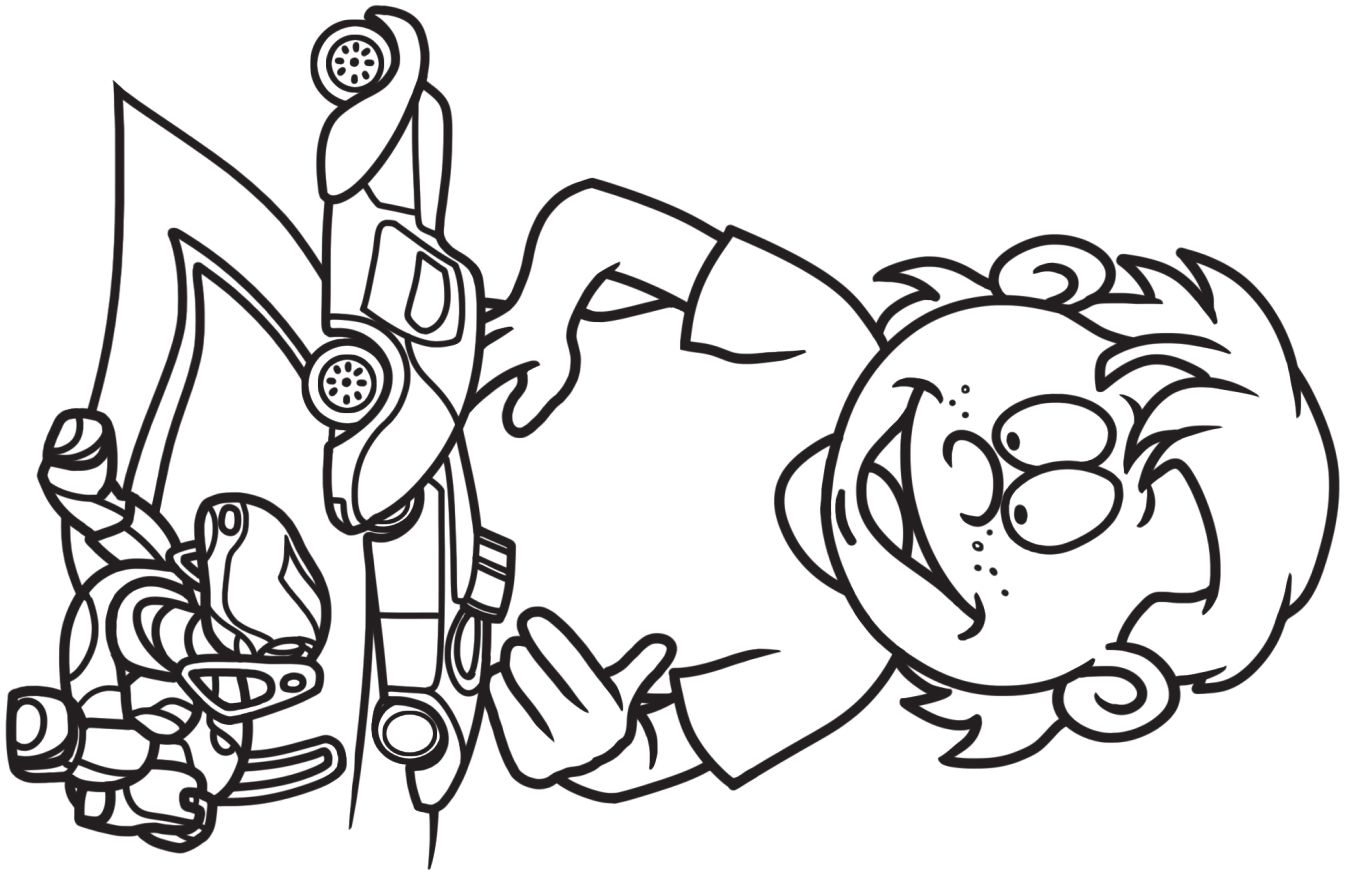
## Suggested Discussion

These are pictures of things most of us do every day. We do them over and over again, each day. Let's read each one. *Refer to each picture as you read them in order.*

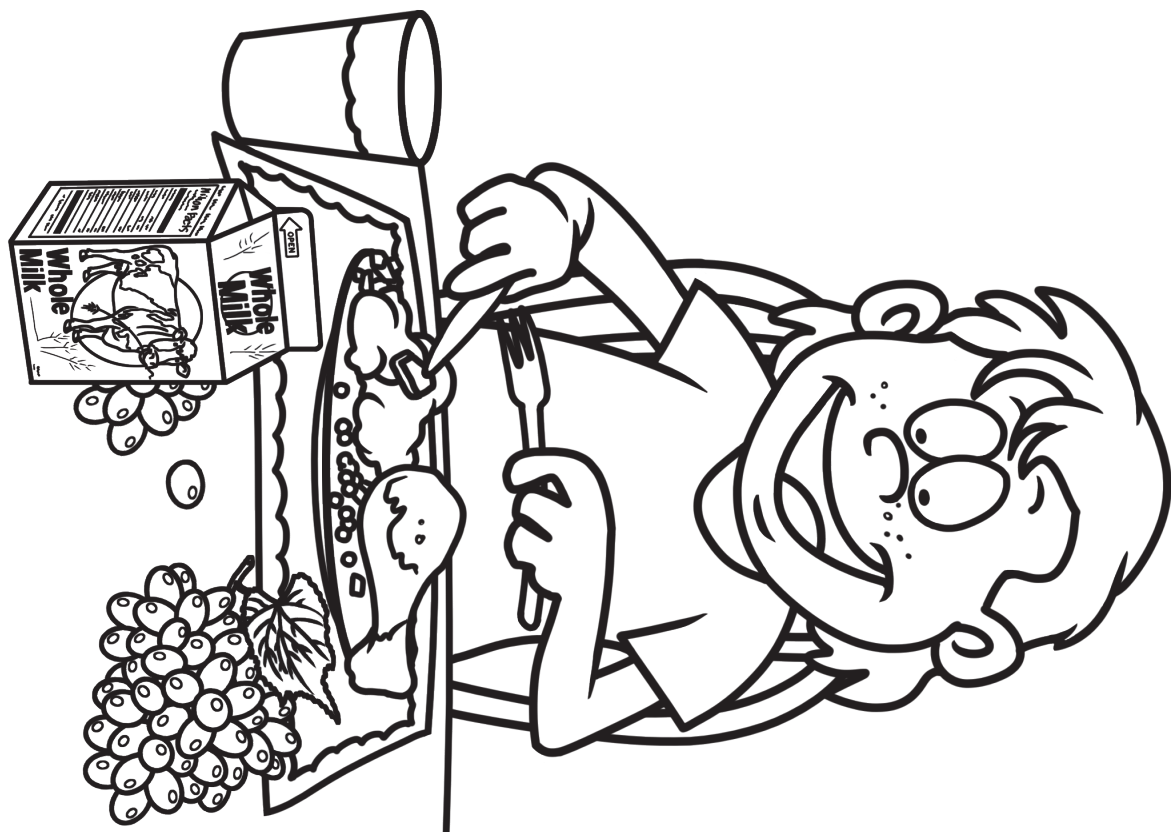
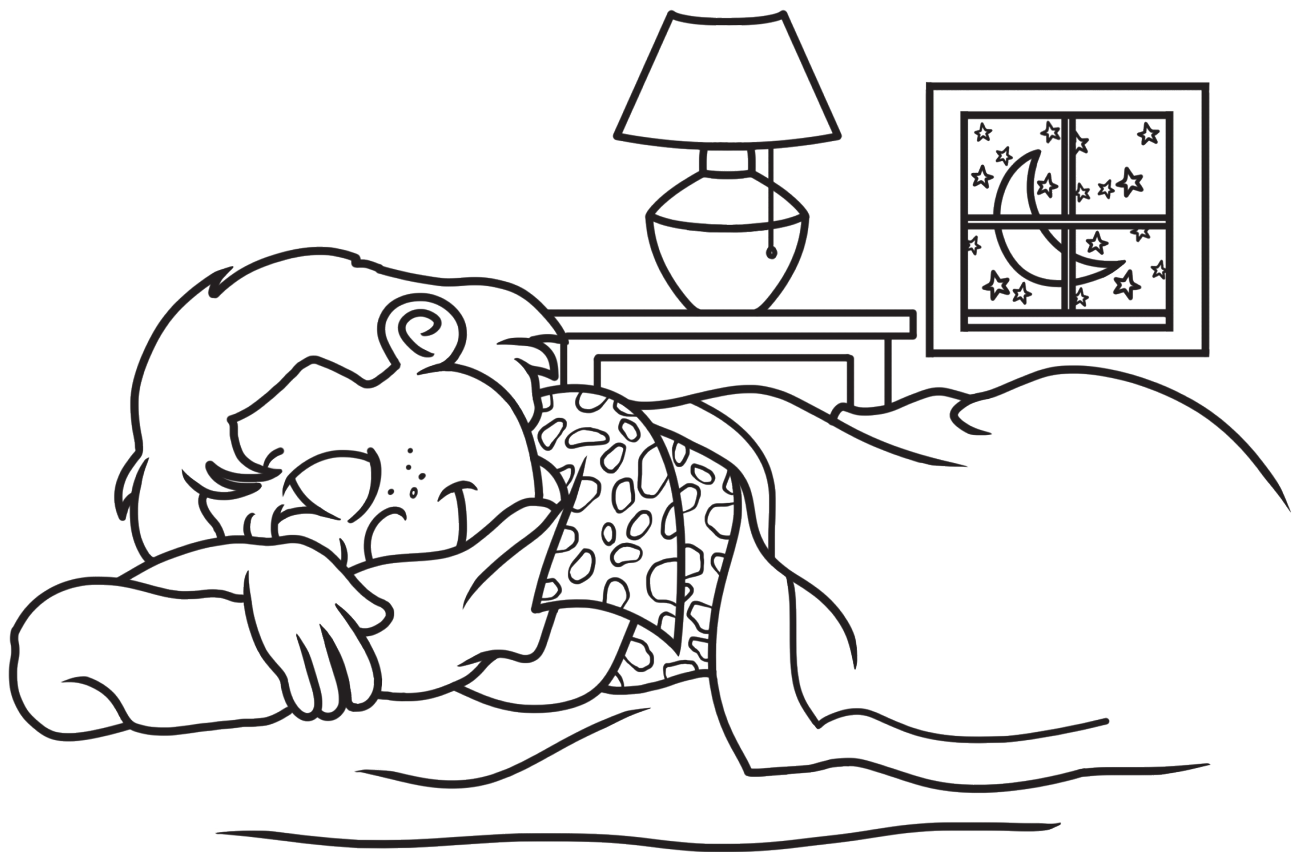
When we do something over and over this way, we may call it a cycle. In our lesson today, we will see how the Israelites started a cycle that went on for many years.
