Review Questions

- 1. What did God require of the Israelites when they settled in the promised land? Obedience to him and his commands.
- 2. What were the Baals? False gods, idols.
- 3. Who taught the Israelites about the Baals? Canaanites, people in the land.
- 4. What were the Israelites supposed to do to the Canaanites that remained in some areas of the land? *Drive them out, destroy them.*
- 5. How did God feel when his people worshipped false gods instead of him? *Angry.*
- 6. How did God punish the Israelites when they disobeyed in the book of Judges? Sent enemies against them.
- 7. Why did God send punishment? What did he want the people to do? Recognize they had sinned and repent.
- 8. When the Israelites cried out to the Lord because of their enemies, what would God do? Raise up a judge to deliver them.
- 9. Were the judges in the Bible more like military leaders or like courtroom judges? Military leaders.
- 10. Who was the first judge God raised up to save the people when they were forced to serve the king of Mesopotamia? *Othniel*.
- 11. After God gave the judges victory, what did the people enjoy in the fifth step of the cycle? Peace and rest.
- **12. What is idolatry?** *Putting anything in our lives above God.*
- 13. What did Jesus ask the young ruler to do? Sell all his possessions and give to the poor then follow him.
- 14. How did the young ruler feel when he heard this? Sad.
- 15. What was the young ruler's idol—the thing he loved more than Jesus? *Riches*.
- **16. Give an example of an idol we may have today.** Answers may include watching TV, playing sports or video games, being good at playing an instrument, having friends, shopping, etc.
- 17. Which of the Ten Commandments are we breaking when we don't put God first and have an idol in our lives? First: You shall have no other gods before me. Second: You shall not make for yourselves an idol.
- 18. What attributes of God do we see in the cycle of Israel's disobedience and deliverance in Judges? Allow several students to answer. Just, holy, merciful, faithful.
- **19. Who can say the memory verse?** Allow several students to recite the verse.

Bonus: About how many years did Israel repeat the cycle in Judges? 300.

Bonus: Who was Othniel's uncle? Caleb.
