Review Questions

- 1. What great catastrophe have we been talking about? The flood of Noah's day.
- 2. What did God tell Noah to build to save him, his family, and many animals from the flood? An ark.
- 3. What was the ark made out of? Gopher wood.
- 4. What did Noah cover the wood with to make it not leak? Pitch.
- 5. Name another instruction God gave Noah about the ark. What other features did it have according to Genesis 6:16? *Roof, door, and three decks.*
- 6. What ancient form of measurement was about 20 inches long? A cubit.
- 7. How tall was the ark? How many stories high was it? 51 feet; five stories high.
- 8. If Noah had school buses at the time, how many could he have fit in the ark? 480!
- 9. God knew what was going to happen and what Noah would need. Which attribute talks about God knowing everything—past, present, and future? *Omniscient*.
- **10.** What will you think now when you see a cute little toy ark in books, on TV, or in a store? Those could never have survived the flood. That is NOT what God's Word says the ark looked like.
- **11.** Why did God bring male and female animals to the ark? Because God wanted them to have babies and fill the earth again after the flood.
- 12. God didn't need to bring every different animal we know of to the ark. He only needed to bring two of each . Kind.
- 13. There is one land animal many people don't believe could have been on the ark. What is it? Dinosaur.
- **14.** How do we know dinosaurs were on the ark? God sent EVERY kind of land animal to get on the ark.
- 15. Poodles, pugs, and wolves are all examples of what animal kind? Dog kind.
- **16.** Name a specific example of an animal in the horse kind. Allow several students to answer. Answers may include donkey, mule, zebra, zorse, pony, or specific horse breeds (Clydesdale, Morgan).
- 17. According to our memory verse, what do we need to enter by to be saved? The door—Jesus.
- **18.** Can you say the verse without looking? Allow several students to try to recite the verse.
