

HomeWord For Parents

Hezekiah was the thirteenth king in Judah. Unlike his father, Ahaz, Hezekiah "trusted in the LORD, the God of Israel, so that there was none like him among all the kings of Judah after him, nor among those who were before him" (2 Kings 18:5). Hezekiah cleansed the temple and rid the land of high places and idols.

expand his kingdom into Judah while Hezekiah was king (Isaiah 36:1). After taking several cities, Sennacherib sent officials and a large portion of his army to Jerusalem with a threatening message that Assyria would defeat them and their God could not protect them (2 Kings 18:13-32).

Upon hearing of Sennacherib's threats, Hezekiah turned to the prophet Isaiah and to fervent prayer for help. Even though his situation was desperate, Hezekiah began his prayer with praise to God then pointed out the powerlessness of the false gods who did not deliver the other nations from Assyria. He asked God to save them so his name would be glorified among the kingdoms of the earth (2 Kings 19:14–19). God answered his prayer and assured Hezekiah of victory over the Assyrians. He promised to deliver Jerusalem and strike down Sennacherib (2 Kings 19:32-37).

God kept his word when the angel of the Lord went through the Assyrian camp at night and destroyed 185,000 soldiers! Sennacherib returned to Nineveh in shame and was killed as God had said. God received the glory for this victory just as Hezekiah prayed he would.
