OutWord *For Family Discussion*

What if your friend said that she prays to Mary when she really needs help? **What could you say?**

That's great that you pray when you're in need of help. Mary is a great example of obedience and humility. But Mary recognized that she, herself, needed the Savior, Jesus, to save her from her sins. She said this in her song of praise to God. Jesus is the only sinless sacrifice and the one who died to save us from our sins. Mary didn't do that. That's why the Bible says Jesus is the only way to God. If you need help, you should pray to the Son of God, Jesus. He is near to those who repent of their sins and trust in him.
