

Jericho Trumpets

NOTE: You may want to use these trumpets for the Battle of Jericho activity.

Materials

- ☐ Trumpet pattern (next page)
- ☐ Decorations: stickers, beads, ribbon, jewel stickers, etc.
- ☐ Crayons
- ☐ Glue
- ☐ Tape
- ☐ Optional: bring a picture of a shofar (ram's horn) to show during discussion



Instructions

Print on card stock and cut out one trumpet pattern for each student, or have students do the cutting. Have students color and decorate their trumpets. Roll them up and tape closed.

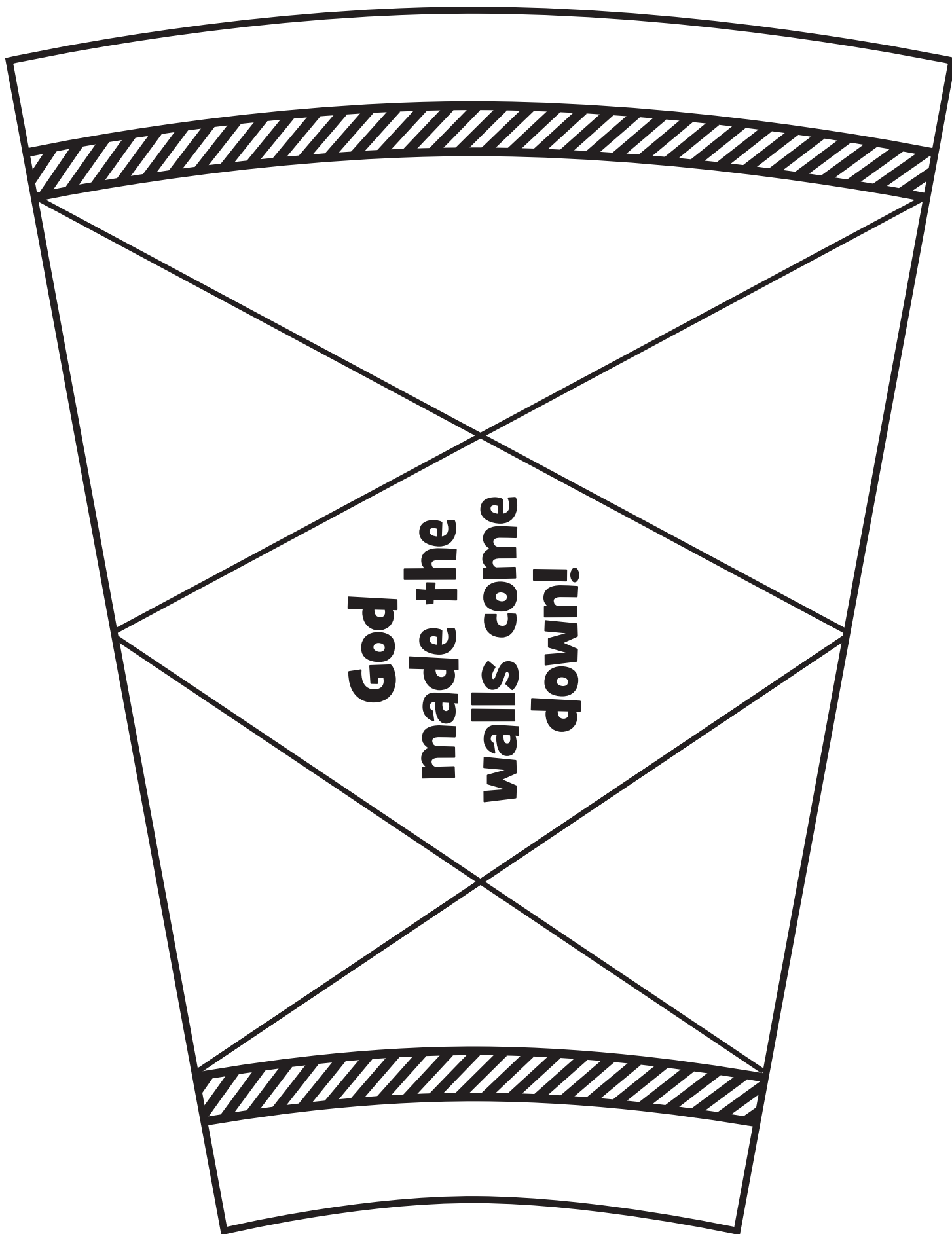
Suggested Discussion

God told Joshua to send his army to march around Jericho for six days. The priests blew their trumpets and carried the ark of the covenant. Their trumpets were made from rams' horns and sounded very loud. *Show picture of a shofar if you brought one or refer to the Flip Chart.*

? Then what happened on the seventh day when they blew the trumpets and the army shouted?
God made the walls come down!

? Did the walls come down because of the loud noise? *No, God made them fall down.*

God did a mighty miracle and made those huge, thick walls tumble down so the Israelites could go right in and take the city. God's instructions were a little strange, but Joshua obeyed. God was faithful to help the Israelites win the battle.
