## **Review Questions**

- 1. After her parents died, Esther was raised by Mordecai. Was Mordecai her uncle, grandfather, or cousin? Cousin.
- 2. What country were Esther and Mordecai living in: Egypt, Persia, or Israel? Persia.
- 3. Who was the king of Persia in the book of Esther: Ahasuerus, Belshazzar, or Cyrus? Ahasuerus.
- **4.** Why were all the beautiful, young women gathered and brought to the palace? The king was looking for a new queen.
- 5. Name one of the things the king's servant did for Esther in the palace. (Allow several students to answer.) He gave her beauty treatments, food, servants, and the best place in the women's house.
- 6. What did the king set on Esther's head to show she was chosen to be queen? Royal crown.
- 7. At the king's gate, what did Mordecai overhear two men planning to do? Murder the king.
- 8. Who was promoted to a powerful position in Persia? Haman.
- 9. Why was Haman angry with Mordecai? He refused to bow to him.
- 10. Haman was so angry that he planned to kill not only Mordecai but who else? All the Jews.
- 11. What did Mordecai ask Esther to do in order to save the Jews? Go before the king and beg for mercy.
- 12. Why was it dangerous for Esther to appear before the king without being called? There was a law that said he could have her killed.
- 13. What did Esther ask Mordecai and the Jews to do before she went before the king: have a party, rest for three days, or fast for three days? Fast for three days.
- 14. What did the king do to welcome Esther when she went to the throne room? Held out his scepter.
- 15. What did the king order to be read to him when he couldn't sleep one night: the book of the chronicles, a bedtime story, or the newspaper? *The book of the chronicles*.
- **16.** What was the king reminded of from the chronicles? That Mordecai had saved his life by reporting the plan to murder him.
- 17. How did the king punish Haman? He was hung on the gallows Haman built to kill Mordecai.
- 18. What did the king let Mordecai do to stop the Jews from being destroyed: gather an army, write a letter to allow them to fight back, or take the throne? Write a letter to allow them to fight back.
