



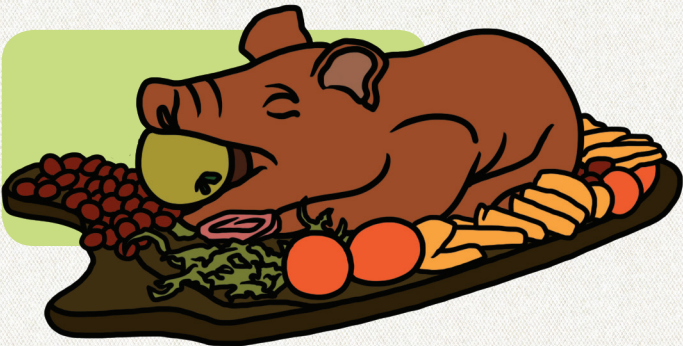

What You Heard *In the Word*

- Daniel, Hananiah, Mishaël, and Azariah were taken to Babylon and trained for the king's service. Their names were changed and they were told to eat the king's rich foods and drink his wine.
- The four young men wanted to obey God. They asked to drink only water and eat only vegetables. God gave them good health, and they were allowed to continue eating those foods. God rewarded them for their obedience with great learning, knowledge, and wisdom.

Ask your child these questions from today's lesson:

1. Why did the king of Babylon change the names of the four young Israelite men? *He wanted them to forget God and serve him instead.*
2. Because Daniel and his friends wanted to obey God, what did they ask to eat and drink instead of the king's rich food and wine? *Vegetables and water.*
3. How did God bless the four young men for their obedience? *He gave them good health, helped them learn, and gave them knowledge and wisdom. He gave Daniel understanding of dreams and visions.*
