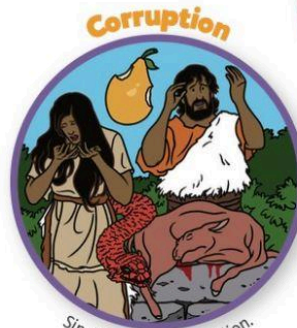

Creation

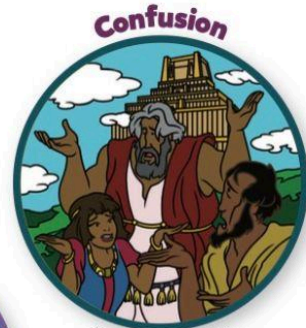


God created all things very good.



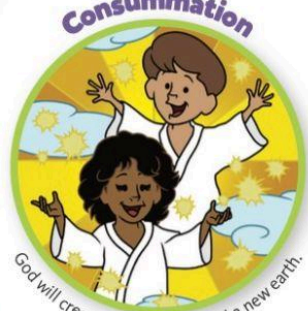
Corruption

Sin entered God's creation.



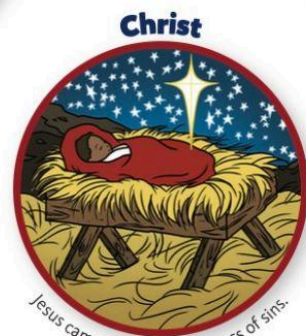
Confusion

God punished sin by confusing the language.



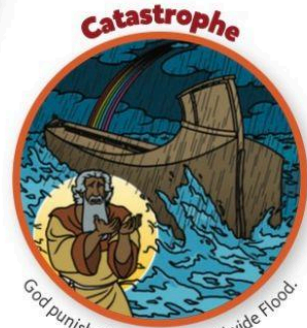
Consummation

God will create a new heaven and a new earth.



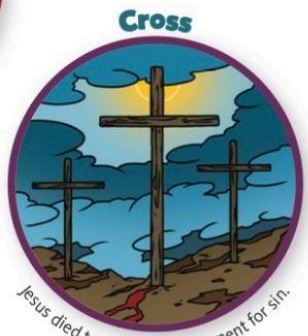
Christ

What You Heard *In the Word*

- The Old Testament tells us that a Savior is coming. God first made this promise after Adam and Eve sinned in the Garden of Eden.
- The New Testament shows God's faithfulness to send Jesus as our Savior. He died on the cross for our sins then rose from the dead to defeat Satan.
