Lesson Focus

Genesis 2 tells about the creation of Adam and Eve. The biblical account of the creation of man contrasts sharply with the evolutionary view. God's creation of Adam and Eve demonstrates that God's design for marriage is one man and one woman for life.

Key Passages

Genesis 2:7–8, 2:18–24; Mark 10:6–9

What You Heard in the Word

- God formed Adam from the dust of the earth, and He created Eve from Adam's rib during Creation Week about 6,000 years ago.
- God set the standard for marriage when He created Adam and Eve—one man and one woman for life.
