What You Heard In the Word

- 2. What are some things the prophets wrote about Jesus? Where he would be born, he would be a ruler, he would be the Savior, he would die, he would not fight or stop his death.
- 3. Since the prophets wrote about things before they happened, how did they know what to write? *God told them what to write*.
