
## Thirsty Camels

## **Materials**

- ☐ Camel patterns and water pots printed on card stock (following page)
- ☐ Crayons, colored pencils, or markers
- ☐ One brass fastener for each student
- ☐ Glue
- ☐ Optional: fabric or felt cut into small rectangles for a blanket for camel
- Optional: decorations (mini-pompoms, jewel stickers, yarn, etc.)



## **Instructions**

Print and cut out one set of the camel pattern and water pot onto card stock for each student or have older students cut out their own.


Have students color their camel patterns then line up the dots on the neck and upper part of body. Insert a brass fastener to attach the head so it moves up and down. Have students color the water pots and make their camels "drink" from them.

Optional: have students add a blanket of fabric/felt or other decorations (stickers, yarn, etc.).

## **Suggested Discussion**

These are funny camels, aren't they? But when you take them home, you can tell your family about our lesson today. Abraham sent his servant on a mission. He knew Isaac needed a wife, and he also trusted that God had the right woman picked out for Isaac.

The servant wasn't sure who this lady was, so he asked God to help him find her. He asked God to show him who she was by letting her be the one who would water all 10 of his camels. That would be a big job. But Rebekah did it. God answered the servant's prayer. He showed the servant that He is in control of everything. And Rebekah became Isaac's wife.
