Suppose one of your friends said he just couldn't believe the account of Joseph, that it wasn't really a part of history. **What would you say?**

The Bible is God's true Word, so it doesn't need to be defended. But there are a lot of details in the account of Joseph that line up with Egyptian history. For example, Joseph was sold by his brothers for 20 shekels. Slavery was a common practice, and 20 shekels was the price of a slave. Also, Egypt was one of the few nations at that time that had prisons, and Joseph was thrown into prison. There are many things that have been discovered that confirm the Bible and what God says.
