What You Heard In the Word


- When God called Jonah to take a message to Nineveh, Jonah disobeyed and boarded a ship going in the opposite direction.

OutWord For Family Discussion

Suppose you heard a friend say that he doesn't believe that anyone could be swallowed by a big fish and live, so he doesn't believe the Bible's account of Jonah is true. What could you say?

I know that every word of God is true. I don't question God's Word because God cannot lie. As the Creator of everything, God could easily control a fish and keep a man alive. I'm not the only one who believes the account of Jonah either. Did you know that Jesus spoke about Jonah and Nineveh in the New Testament? He said that Jonah was in the belly of the great fish for three days and nights. Jesus knew the events in the book of Jonah really happened,



HomeWord For Parents

Jonah was a prophet of God who was called from his ministry in Israel to deliver a message to the people of Nineveh (Jonah 1:1). Nineveh was the capital of Assyria, a nation known for godlessness, idolatry, and cruelty. The Jews despised these pagan Gentiles. This hatred was part of the reason why Jonah disobeyed God's command and boarded a ship headed to Tarshish, which was in the opposite direction from Nineveh. But Jonah couldn't outrun God!

The Lord sent a great storm on the sea until the ship's crew threw Jonah overboard, where God caused a great fish to swallow Jonah. He was in the belly of the fish three days and nights! Finally, Jonah prayed to the Lord. God heard his prayer and spoke to the fish, which vomited the prophet onto dry ground (Jonah 2:1 & 10).

God answered Jonah's prayer and gave him another opportunity to go to the Ninevites and preach the message of repentance. This time Ionah obeyed!

Jonah warned the people of Nineveh of the coming disaster if they would not repent within 40 days (Jonah 3:4). And the people believed and repented, from the least of them to the king (Jonah 3:5). They proclaimed a fast and put on sackcloth as a sign of their repentance. Then God relented and did not bring the disaster he had planned (Jonah 3:10). His abundant grace and mercy were bestowed on Jonah and on the people of a pagan city. However, this did not please Jonah. He was angry with God for showing mercy, and God had to correct his attitude.

God's grace and mercy are just as evident today. He sent Jesus to pay the penalty for our sins. He will hold back the punishment for sin and offer forgiveness to everyone who cries to him in repentance and faith.
