Wisdom Bookmark

Materials

Wisdom letters (next page)
1½-inch wide ribbon cut into 12-inch lengths for each student
Scissors
Glue
Colored pencils, crayons, or markers
Optional: glitter, stickers

Instructions

Print one set of letters on card stock for each student. Have students color the letters then cut them out.

Give each student one piece of wide ribbon. Have them fold one end in half lengthwise and cut at an angle from the center to the outside corner to make two points on the end.

Have students glue the letters to the ribbon to create a bookmark. They may turn the letters any direction, horizontally or vertically, along the length of the ribbon.

Optional: Have students decorate with glitter and stickers.


Remind students to allow glue to dry before using the bookmarks in their Bibles.


Suggested Discussion


Solomon asked for wisdom to discern between right and wrong so he could rule God's people well. We can ask God for wisdom too, like our memory verse tells us.
