Review Questions

- 1. Hezekiah became king of which nation when he was 25 years old? Judah.
- 2. Who was Hezekiah's father: Amaziah or Ahaz? Ahaz.
- 3. What kind of king was Hezekiah? Good. He did what was right.
- **4.** Name one of the good things Hezekiah did as king. (Allow several students to answer.) He destroyed the idols and high places in the land; he cleansed the temple, brought the priests and Levites back to work there, and obeyed God's laws for worship.
- 5. What nation attacked and defeated Israel and its capital city of Samaria during Hezekiah's reign? Assyria.
- 6. What was the ambassador of the Assyrian army called? Rabshakeh.
- 7. The Rabshakeh came with an army and surrounded what city where Hezekiah was? Jerusalem.
- 8. What language did the Rabshakeh use to deliver his message so all the people could hear and understand? *Language of Judah*; *Hebrew.*
- **9.** What did the Rabshakeh tell the people NOT to do? Believe that Hezekiah or the Lord would deliver them from his army.
- 10. Why did King Hezekiah tear his clothes and put on sackcloth when he heard the Rabshakeh's message? He was showing sorrow; he was humbling himself before God.
- 11. What prophet of God did Hezekiah send his servants to? Isaiah.
- **12.** What message did Isaiah give Hezekiah from God about the king of Assyria? He didn't need to be afraid; God would take care of him.
- 13. What did God say would happen to the king of Assyria? He would return to his own land and be killed.
- 14. What did Sennacherib send to Hezekiah next to tell him that he would take over their land just like all the other nations he conquered? A letter.
- **15.** Where did Hezekiah take this threatening letter? To the house of the Lord; the temple.
- **16.** How did Hezekiah begin his prayer during this desperate time? By praising God.
- **17.** How did Hezekiah describe false gods in his prayer? They were not gods, but the work of man, made with wood and stone (powerless).
- 18. What was Hezekiah's request at the end of his prayer? He asked God to save them from the king of Assyria.
- 19. Who did Hezekiah want to receive the glory for saving them? God.
- 20. What did God promise to do for the city of Jerusalem? Save it; defend it; not let the Assyrians in.
- **21.** How did God keep his promise? What did he do to the Assyrian army? The angel of the Lord killed 185,000 soldiers at night, forcing Sennacherib to leave Judah.
- **22.** How did God keep his promise about what would happen to Sennacherib? Sennacherib returned to Assyria and was killed, just as God prophesied through Isaiah.
- 23. What attributes of God do we see in the account of Hezekiah and the Assyrians? *Omnipotent (all-powerful); faithful.*
