Tabernacle or Temple Race

Materials

Masking tape or cone
Tape/poster putty
Signs (next page)
Clues (at right)

Instructions

Print and cut out one copy of the two signs. Clear a large space with no obstacles (chairs/tables). Tape each sign on walls opposite each other. Mark a line in the middle of the room between the two signs using masking tape or cones.

Have students line up on the center line. Explain that you'll be reading clues about the tabernacle and the temple. If the clue fits the temple, they will all run to that sign/wall. If it describes the tabernacle, they will run to that sign/wall. If the clue fits BOTH the tabernacle and the temple, they must remain frozen on the center line. If they run to the wrong sign or jump off the center line when they should freeze, they are out.

Read the clues, mixing up the order, and have students run to the signs or freeze then return to the center after each round. Play for a set time or until all clues are read.

Option: instead of students going out for a wrong choice, award a point for every clue they get correct. Have students keep track of their scores and see who has the most points at the end.
