## **Review Questions**

- 1. What prophet did we read about in today's lesson? Jeremiah.
- 2. Jeremiah had a long ministry during the reigns of how many kings of Judah: 3, 5, or 7? Five.
- 3. What two books in the Old Testament did Jeremiah write? Jeremiah and Lamentations.
- 4. Jeremiah and Lamentations are in what section of the Old Testament: books of the law, major prophets, or minor prophets? *Major prophets*.
- 5. Jeremiah received his calling from God during the reign of which king: Hezekiah, Joash, or Josiah? *Josiah*.
- 6. What two things did Jeremiah tell God he was worried about when God gave him his calling to be a prophet? He wasn't a good speaker; he was young.
- 7. When did God know Jeremiah's special calling: before he was born, when he was a boy, or when he grew up? *Before he was born.*
- 8. What did God promise Jeremiah? That he would be with him and give him the words to say.
- 9. Whose house did God tell Jeremiah to visit? The potter's house.
- 10. What do potters use to make vessels like bowls, jars, pots, and cups? Clay; mixture of mud and water.
- 11. What did Jeremiah see when he went to the potter's house? What happened to the vessel the potter was making? The vessel on the potter's wheel was spoiled, so he remade it into another vessel.
- 12. What was the message for the people of Judah from the potter and his clay? What was God giving them a picture of? God was the potter and Judah was the clay, about to be crushed and remade because they were spoiled by sin.
- **13.** Why didn't the people listen to God's message from Jeremiah? They wanted to follow their own plans and do their own (evil) things rather than repent and obey God.
- 14. Where was Jeremiah speaking when Pashhur heard him and decided to punish him: the potter's house, the palace, or the temple? *The temple*.
- 15. What was Pashhur's job: potter, prophet, or priest? Priest.
- **16.** How did Pashhur punish Jeremiah for speaking in the temple? He beat him and put him in the stocks.
- **17.** Why was being put in the stocks so humiliating? It was a public punishment where everyone could walk by and see him.
- **18.** Why is Jeremiah called the "weeping prophet"? He wept/cried over the sin of the people and their stubbornness to listen and repent.
- 19. How is Jeremiah an example to us of how we should feel toward those who reject God and treat us badly? We should feel a burden to see people repent and turn to Jesus to avoid the punishment of hell. We should keep obeying God no matter what people say or do to try to stop us.
- **20.** Who can say the memory verse? Allow students to recite the verse.
