All right! Listen up as we review the last nine lessons! This will help you during the game we'll play later.

Lesson 11

Slide #4

Show Lesson 11 Theme Poster. The Bible is the history book of the universe! There are Seven C's of History to help us remember what the history in the Bible includes.

Creation: God created everything in the universe in six normal days. It was NOT millions of years ago—but just about 6,000 years ago.

Corruption: Sin entered the world when Adam and Eve disobeyed God in the garden of Eden.

Catastrophe: God judged man's sin with a worldwide flood. Noah and his family were the only people who lived through it—only eight people survived.

Confusion: Men sinned again! And God again punished them—this time by confusing their one language into many languages.

Christ: Men would continue to sin, and God must judge sin. But, God sent his Son, Jesus Christ, to provide a way for sinners to be saved.

Cross: Jesus, the perfect man, became the perfect sacrifice for sins when he died on the cross and took the punishment that sinners deserve from God.

Consummation: This will happen at the end of history. Jesus will return for all believers. And God will create a new heaven and new earth where they will live forever with God.

Lesson 12

Show Lesson 12 Theme Poster. The Bible tells us how God created the universe—in six days. On day one, God created the heavens, earth, and light. On day two, God created the expanse, which included the atmosphere and outer space. On day three, God created dry land and all the plants. On day four, God created the sun, moon, stars, and planets. On day five, God created all the sea creatures and flying creatures. And on day six, God created land animals and his most precious creation—man, who is made in his image.

Refer to the Attributes of God Poster. Which attribute of God describes his amazing power to do whatever he wants? Omnipotent.

We can only imagine God's omnipotence as we read and think about how he brought everything into existence by the power of his word.

Lesson 13

Show Lesson 13 Theme Poster. God created the universe by the power of his word. And he did it in just six 24-hour days! We know they were 24-hour days because of the way the Hebrew word yom is used in Genesis. The Bible says "evening and morning" and the specific day—first, second, third, etc. In the Bible, when the word yom is used this way, it means a regular day of 24 hours!

God's Word is true. We can trust it! And when God says he created plants to reproduce according to their kinds, we can believe it. This just makes sense. When we plant things, this is exactly what happens. An apple seed will grow an apple tree. The seed for a rose bush will grow a rose bush. One kind of animal or one kind of plant will never turn into something different than what God designed it to be.

Lesson 14

Show Lesson 14 Theme Poster. We read about days five and six of creation week from God's Word. We saw how God created the creatures that fill the sky and waters on day five. We were reminded that even the extinct animals, such as dinosaurs, were made at the same time—about 6,000 years ago—not millions of years ago.

On day six God also created the first man and woman. What were their names? Adam and Eve.

God created people very different from the animals. Can you name some of the ways people are different from animals? What kinds of things can we do? People can reason, write, communicate, learn, love each other, forgive someone, ask forgiveness, know right from wrong—and most importantly, we can have a relationship with God through Jesus Christ.

We are nothing like the animals around us. And we did not evolve from any animal. We are a unique, special creation—made in God's image.

Lesson 15

Show Lesson 15 Theme Poster. The Bible tells us very specifically, with lots of detail, how God created man and then woman. Because Genesis is a historical account, we know that everything he tells us is true.

God created Adam from the dust of the earth and then created Eve from Adam's rib. They were created on day six of creation week—only about 6,000 years ago—not millions of years ago like some evolutionists would have us believe. We did not evolve from ape-like creatures! We are not animals. We are human beings made uniquely by God in his image!

When God created Eve, the first woman, and then brought her to Adam, that was the first marriage. God said a man would leave his father and mother and join with his wife when they got married.

Jesus taught the same thing. He said that no one should separate a man and a woman once they are married. They should stay married for life. This is God's perfect plan for marriage.

Lesson 16

Show Lesson 16 Theme Poster. In Lesson 16, we read about two dinosaur-like creatures described in the book of Job. The Behemoth was a great land-dwelling animal that fits the description of a great Brachiosaurus dinosaur.

On which day of creation week was Behemoth created? Day six.

The Leviathan was a sea creature that breathed fire and smoke from his mouth and nose. This is the description of a dragon! And the fact that these animals really did exist explains the many dragon "legends" heard around the world. These legends all talk about animals like the Leviathan described in the Bible.

These animals—the dinosaurs and the dragons—really lived! And they were created on days five and six of creation week.

Lesson 17

Show Lesson 17 Theme Poster. In Lesson 17 we learned what the Bible says about the age of the earth. The genealogies in Genesis are very important! They are God's Word, and they tell us how old the earth is. We figured exactly how the ages and names listed in Genesis 5 and 11 come together to give us an amazing "birth certificate" for the earth. We can be confident that the Genesis passages, along with other historical resources, calculate the age of the earth accurately—and it comes to about 6,000 years old!

Many scientists say that radiometric dating is the way to go for dating rocks and the earth. But that is not true. This method of dating is NOT reliable! Any date that is millions or billions of years ago is not biblical—it does not agree with the Bible.

We should always trust what God's Word says. God was there in the beginning! He knows exactly what happened and tells us about it in his Word. His Word is

true.

Lesson 18

Show Lesson 18 Theme Poster. God created Adam and Eve and then gave them dominion—responsibility or rule—over the earth. They were to take care of the garden and all the animals God put there. This dominion, or rule, was given as a privilege and a responsibility. This same dominion has been given to us. It is a very big responsibility that we all should take seriously.

Some, however, take it too seriously. They love the earth so much that they have forgotten the one who created it.

What do these people worship instead of the Creator? The creation.

We all need to work at taking care of the earth in order to honor and glorify God. But we must never concentrate so much on the earth that we forget God, Jesus Christ, or the gospel. These are the things our minds need to be set on while we do our part to take care of our home—planet earth.

Many people worry about global warming and the temperatures on the earth. They are afraid that we are destroying the planet by how we live. However, God has promised to keep the earth as he wants it. When he is ready for the world to end, it will! But not before God's perfect time. In the meantime, God has promised to keep the earth going just as it has been.

Lesson 19

Show Lesson 19 Theme Poster. In Lesson 19, we moved on to our second C in the Seven C's of History—Corruption!

What was the very first sin? Adam and Eve disobeyed God's command and ate the fruit from the tree of the knowledge of good and evil.

Sin entered the world when Adam and Eve disobeyed God. This first sin led to the first death in the universe! God killed an animal to provide clothes for Adam and Eve to cover them and their sin. This first death was a sign of something to come. Someone else would have to die and shed his blood.

The one to come was Jesus Christ, God's only Son—the perfect sacrifice. He died once for all sinners. Then he was raised from the dead. Jesus offers complete forgiveness of sins to all who repent, turn away from their old sinful lives, believe in him, and receive him in faith.
