Review Questions

- 1. True or false: Psalms is the largest book of the Bible. True.
- 2. Where is Psalms located in the Bible: the beginning, middle, or end? Middle.
- 3. What psalm is our memory verse from? Psalm 32.
- 4. What type of book is the book of Psalms: history, epistles, or poetry? Poetry.
- 5. What do psalms teach us to do? Worship God with our words.
- **6.** What did the Israelites use Psalms for? A songbook for praising and worshipping God.
- 7. Which psalm is the shortest chapter in the Bible: Psalm 119, 117, or 1? Psalm 117.
- 8. Which psalm is the longest chapter in the Bible: Psalm 1, 119, or 27? Psalm 119.
- 9. We read Psalm 117. It started and ended with the words, "Praise the Lord!" What type of psalm is it: praise, lament, or thanksgiving? *Praise*.
- **10.** What are some ways the psalms remind us to praise and worship God? Allow several students to answer. Sing, play instruments, pray, shout, remember what he's done.
- 11. How many psalms are there: 150, 25, or 200? 150.
- 12. David wrote Psalm 3 when he fled from Absalom. What kind of psalm is it? A psalm of lament.
- 13. What does lament mean? Crying out to God and asking God why.
- 14. What type of psalm reminds us to give thanks to God? Psalm of thanksgiving.
- **15.** Name something we can thank God for. Who he is and the things he has done (e.g., his attributes, creation, mighty deeds, answers to prayer).
- 16. Who wrote over 70 of the psalms? King David.
- 17. How many writers' names do we have for the psalms? Seven.
- 18. True or false: the book of Psalms is a collection of prayers and songs. True.
- 19. How can we use the psalms? We can read them as prayers or songs to God when we're not sure what to say.
- **20.** Name another writer God guided to write a psalm besides David. (Allow several students to answer.) Asaph, Sons of Korah, Moses, Solomon, Heman, Ethan.
