- 1. What prophet did we read about today? Jonah.
- 2. What city did God tell Jonah to go preach to? Nineveh.
- 3. Why didn't Jonah want to go to Nineveh? The people there (the Assyrians) were enemies of Israel. It was a wicked city.
- **4.** How did Jonah attempt to flee from the presence of the Lord? He got on a ship headed in the opposite direction (to Tarshish).
- 5. What attributes of God show that it was foolish for Jonah to try to run from him? They start with "omni." Omnipresent (present everywhere) and omniscient (all-knowing).
- 6. What did God send to stop Jonah's ship? Terrible storm, tempest.
- 7. What did the crew do to try to lighten the ship? Threw the cargo overboard.
- 8. What was Jonah doing during the storm? Sleeping.
- 9. What did Jonah tell the crew he had done that caused the storm? He had disobeyed the Lord and tried to flee from him.
- 10. What did Jonah say the crew needed to do to stop the storm? Throw him into the sea; throw him overboard.
- **11.** What happened when the crew followed Jonah's instructions to toss him overboard? The sea instantly became calm.
- **12.** What did the crew learn about the God of Israel? He is the true God who controls the sea and everything in creation.
- 13. What did God send to swallow Jonah? Great fish.
- 14. How long was Jonah in the belly of the fish? Three days and nights.
- 15. What did Jonah finally do from the belly of the fish? He prayed and repented.
- 16. What did God cause the fish to do to Jonah after he repented? Vomit him up on dry land.
- 17. What did Jonah do once he was back on land? He obeyed God and went to Nineveh to preach.
- 18. What did Jonah say was coming to Nineveh? Disaster, punishment from God.
- 19. How did the people of Nineveh respond to Jonah's message from God? They believed it and repented.
- **20.** How did God show grace and mercy to Nineveh? He chose not to send the disaster he had warned about because they repented and turned from their sins.
- 21. How did Jonah feel about God's mercy toward Nineveh? He was angry and displeased.
- **22.** Why did God rebuke or correct Jonah for his attitude toward Nineveh? Jonah did not love his enemies or want to see God show mercy and forgiveness to them.
- **23.** What lessons can we learn from the account of Jonah? Answers will vary but may include the following: to obey God the first time, to realize that we can't hide from God, to love our enemies, and to share the gospel with all people.
