



1 Samuel 3:1–18

Samuel heard someone call his name. Each time, he ran to see why Eli had called him. But it wasn't Eli; it was God! Find the right path to Eli's room.





% What You Heard In the Word

- Samuel thought he heard Eli calling him during the night, but it was really God calling him.
- Samuel was chosen as God's prophet, but his first job was difficult. He had to deliver a message of judgment on Israel and Eli's family.

Ask your child these questions from today's lesson:

- 1. How many times did Samuel get up and run to Eli's room when he heard someone call his name? *Three times*.
- 2. What kind of message did God give to Samuel to tell Eli? A message of punishment.
- 3. How did Samuel feel about this message he had to give to Eli? *He was scared, but he told Eli anyway.*
