

Lesson 2: The Journey to Mount Moriah

Gen. 22:1-19

Consider Christ

1. (Gen. 22:2) When God commanded Abraham to sacrifice his only son, Isaac, He did not give Abraham an explanation of how it would all work out. Why is it important that we obey God even if we do not know what the outcome will be?
2. (Gen. 22:3) Abraham “rose up early” to leave on his journey to Mt. Moriah. He did not procrastinate. Why do we sometimes struggle to obey God immediately?
3. (Gen. 22:5) When Abraham began his journey to worship the Lord on Mt. Moriah, he left his supplies and servants at the base of the mountain. What are some things **we** may need to leave behind that could hinder **us** from fully following the Lord?
4. (Heb. 11:6) What one element is required in order to please God?
 - *Why is faith necessary to please God?*
 - *What area of your life would you say you struggle with most when it comes to trusting God?*
5. (Heb. 11:11) Despite her circumstances, it was Sarah’s faith in God’s Word that gave her the strength to conceive. What does this teach us about how we are to respond to God when our circumstances seem to go against what God is telling us?
6. How did this lesson speak to you and what action step will it lead you to take? (“*Because of what I learned, I will...*”)
7. Share one thing God spoke to you about during your daily devotional time this past week.
