Journeys of Faith

1. (Gen. 6:5-6) Why did God regret that He had created the world? What did He decide to do as a result?
 - *What does that tell us about the effects and consequences of sin?*
2. What did the people have to do if they wanted to escape God's judgment in the flood?
 - *What must people do, today, to escape the Judgment of God?*
3. (Gen. 6:9) What made Noah different from everyone else in his generation? How was that evidenced in his life?
 - *How can we stand out for God in our generation, and be different from the world around us?*
 - *What areas would you say that Christians seem to struggle with most when it comes to being different from the world?*
4. (Gen. 6:22) Do you think it was easy for Noah to obey God, for over a hundred years, while everyone mocked him?
 - *What lesson can we learn from his example that will help us remain faithful in spite of opposition?*
5. (Heb. 11:7) What does it mean that Noah prepared the ark "to the saving of his house"? How can our faith affect our family, too?
6. How did this lesson speak to you and what action step will it lead you to take? (*"Because of what I learned, I will..."*)
7. Share one thing God spoke to you about during your daily devotional time this past week.
