John 1:43-51 Consider Christ

1. (John 1:43) Before Philip could bring someone else to Christ, what did Jesus call Him to do, first?

- Why is it necessary that we follow Christ, first, before trying to lead others to Christ?
- 2. (John 1:45) When witnessing to Nathanael, Philip first talked about Moses and the prophets. He used the Scriptures. Read (Isa. 55:11 & Heb. 4:12) According to these verses, why is it important that we use Scripture when talking to people about Jesus?
- 3. (John 1:46) When Philip told Nathanael about Christ, Philip did not try to argue with Nathanael; He simply said, "Come and see." Why was this an effective method of witnessing?
  - How can arguing with someone over the gospel actually end up being counterproductive in bringing them to Christ?
- 4. (John 1:48) How does this verse illustrate Christ's omniscience?
- 5. (Prov. 15:3) How should Christ's omniscience (the fact that He knows everything) be an encouragement to us?
- 6. How did this lesson speak to you and what action step will it lead you to take? ("Because of what I learned, I will...")
- 7. Share one thing God spoke to you about during your daily devotional time this past week.
