

Lesson 6: Consider His Lordship

Luke 6:39-49

Consider Christ

1. (Luke 6:39) Why is it important that the leaders we follow are following the Lord?
2. (Luke 6:43-44) If a good tree does not produce corrupt fruit, and “every tree is known by his own fruit,” what should we expect to see in the life of a person who is yielded to Jesus as Lord?
3. (Luke 6:45) What do the words that come out of our mouth reveal about us?
4. (Luke 6:46) What is one evidence that someone has not truly surrendered to Jesus as their Lord?
 - *If others know we profess to be a Christian, yet we are living in disobedience to God’s Word, what does that say about us?*
5. (Luke 6:49) What does Jesus liken a person to who hear His Word but doesn’t obey it? Explain.
6. What is the biggest reason we refuse the lordship of Christ?
7. What are our outward actions a true reflection of?
8. What would it look like, practically, to live out this truth, or how would your life look different if Jesus was in complete control of your life?
9. Share one thing God spoke to you about during your daily devotional time this past week.
