Mark 4:35-41 Consider Christ

1. (Mark 4:40) The disciple's initial reaction to the storm was fear. What is it about facing storms and trials that make us fearful?

- Jesus also said the disciples had no faith. How does our fear display a lack of faith in God in the midst of our trials?
- What does Jesus' response to them reveal about His expect-ations of His followers?
- 2. (Mark 4:38) What did the disciples accuse Jesus of?
 - Have you ever been tempted to think God didn't care when you were going through a storm in your life? Explain
- 3. (Mark 4:39) Jesus rebuked the wind and sea and there was "a great calm." What does this teach us about God's power?
 - How should this encourage us when we are in a storm?
- 4. What are some ways we can minister to others who are facing storms in their lives?
- 5. Some people think that if they are living for the Lord, they won't experience any trials. Is this true? Why or why not?
- 6. How did this lesson speak to you and what action step will it lead you to take? ("Because of what I learned, I will...")
- 7. Share one thing God spoke to you about during your daily devotional time this past week.

GROUP PRAYER TIME (Take any prayer requests)

- Pray for the prayer requests given.
- Whatever the Lord spoke to you about in this lesson, turn that into a prayer back to God. Is there something you need to *correct*, *confess*, or *continue* doing...tell Him about it.
- While one person is praying aloud, everyone else should focus on what is being prayed and should agree with them in prayer, until it is your turn to pray.
