Joshua 2:1-9

Journeys of Faith

1. Describe Rahab's reputation before she was saved. What made her an unlikely candidate (in the eyes of many) for salvation?
 - *What lesson should this teach us about those who we think are "unlikely" candidates to be saved?*
2. Rahab was also involved in idolatry before she was saved. Today, an idol can be anything that we put before the Lord in our lives. What are some idols we may be tempted to have?
3. (Josh. 2:4-5) Rahab risked her life by hiding the spies. What is an area you are most likely to fear taking a risk and stepping out of your comfort zone for God?
4. (Josh. 2:9) Rahab acknowledged that the spies were representatives of the true God. If they had exhibited a poor testimony in front of her, how might that have caused her to view God differently?
 - *Why is it important that we maintain the right testimony in front of the lost around us?*
5. (Josh. 2:11) Rahab's heart was affected after she heard what the Lord had done for Israel. What should that teach us about how God can use our testimony to affect the heart of a lost person?
6. How did this lesson speak to you and what action step will it lead you to take? (*"Because of what I learned, I will..."*)
7. Share one thing God spoke to you about during your daily devotional time this past week.
