# STUDY QUESTIONS

## GETTING STARTED:

How has modern technology like doorbell cameras changed the way we welcome people into our homes and lives, and what does this reveal about our posture toward unexpected interactions with our community?

## A DEEPER DIVE:

- » **Read Mark 1:30-31.** Peter's mother-in-law's immediate response to being healed was to serve. What does this teach us about the relationship between experiencing Jesus' love and serving others?
- » The sermon mentioned that "the proper response for someone who has been touched by Jesus is to serve." How has encountering Jesus changed the way you serve others? Share a specific example.
- » **Read Philippians 2:1-4.** What are the "if's" and "then's" in these verses? How does our experience of Christ's love motivate us to serve?
- » **Read Mark 1:32-34.** Jesus met both physical and spiritual needs. Which type of need do you find easier to address in your community? Why might that be?
- » In the passage, the whole town gathered at the door of Peter's home. What does it mean for our homes to become hubs for serving our community?
- » **Read Mark 1:35.** Why did Jesus prioritize time alone with the Father? What does this teach us about sustainable ministry and service?
- » **Read Mark 1:36-39.** The disciples wanted Jesus to stay where He was popular, but Jesus stayed focused on His mission. What distracts you from the Great Commission (reaching people far from God and discipling people near to God)?

## NEXT STEPS:

As individuals and as a church, what might we need to say "no" to so we can say "yes" to God's mission?
