STUDY QUESTIONS

GETTING STARTED:

What's one household chore you're really good at and one you tend to avoid? (Share a funny story if you have one!)

A DEEPER DIVE:

- » **Read Mark 10:32-45.** What stands out to you about James and John's request immediately after Jesus shared His plan to die? How do you think Jesus felt in that moment?
- » In verse 43, Jesus said, *"Not so with you."* What is Jesus contrasting between worldly leadership and kingdom leadership? How does this apply to family life?
- » **Read Philippians 2:3-8.** What specific characteristics of Jesus' servant leadership does Paul highlight? Which one challenges you the most?
- » Jesus made Himself nothing by taking the nature of a servant, though He was God. What status, recognition, or personal ambition might God be calling you to lay down in order to serve your family more fully?
- » When giving a last lesson on servant leadership, Jesus picked up the towel and washed His disciples' feet. How do you think that moment moved their hearts? What was Jesus' main point, and where was He trying to guide them?
- » The sermon mentioned that "algorithms don't love your kids." Where are you currently looking for guidance in your marriage, parenting, or family relationships? Are those sources aligned with biblical principles?
- » Who are the older, wiser believers in your life that you could learn from? If you don't have any, how could you intentionally seek out a mentor or mentoring couple?
