STUDY QUESTIONS

GETTING STARTED:

When you think back on the past year, what's one word you would use to describe it spiritually? Why that word?

When you think about this new year, what's one word you hope will describe it spiritually? Why that word?

A DEEPER DIVE:

- Where do you see God calling our church to live out a stronger WE mindset this year?
- How can small acts—like serving, adjusting schedules, or showing hospitality—be powerful expressions of spiritual maturity?
- What do you appreciate most about the life of our church, and what would it look like for you personally to fully invest in this church family??

NEXT STEPS:
