A DEEPER DIVE:

The Spirit of Jesus.

 Which of these evidences that the Holy Spirit (Galatians 5:22-23) is working through me needs more prayerful consideration — love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control?

The church stands for life.

 Which realization that Jesus brings and cares about life (John 10:10) would make me a stronger and more faithful follower of Him — practicing the fact that eternal life starts here and now, respecting the lives of everyone of every age all around me, or rejoicing in the hope of life after life?

We need family, fellowship, and community.

How can I appreciate and offer (Ephesians 2:19) a loving and serving family
of faith to both long-term and brand-new followers of Jesus and seekers
after life in this fellowship? Will we be "people who are his very own?"
