OPENING QUESTION:

Share about a time in your life when you felt left out. What types of feelings accompany the memory?

DISCUSSION:

- 1. What comparisons and prejudices have you encountered in life? Have your own comparisons and prejudices changed as you've gotten older?
- 2. What are the disciples angry about in Luke 9:51-56 and how did they want to respond? What is the significance of Samaria and why was there such hostility between the Samaritans and the Jews culturally?
 - a. For further discussion, what other references come to mind when you think of Jesus interacting with Samaritans?
- 3. What can we learn from Jesus' rebuke of the disciples? What prejudices might Jesus rebuke today?
- 4. What is Paul's message in Colossians 3:1-14? Where do you see the theme of mutuality?
- 5. Reread Colossians 3:14. How are love and harmony linked? Can you have one without the other? Are there any restrictions to love?
- 6. Thinking eternally, what will heaven look like? How does Jesus' commission in Matthew 28:19-20 help give us a glimpse into the makeup of people in heaven?

MY NEXT STEP:

What action will you take this week to show empathy to those who encounter prejudice? Ask God to open your eyes to the perspective of people different from you.
