STUDY QUESTIONS

GETTING STARTED:

Share a time when you had to make a decision without knowing what the outcome would be. What made it difficult? How did you eventually move forward?

A DEEPER DIVE:

Read Hebrews 11:1-2

 How does the writer of Hebrews define faith? Why do you think confidence and assurance without seeing is so challenging for us?

Read Hebrews 11:24-27

- What specific choices did Moses make that demonstrated his faith? What did he give up, and what was he holding onto instead?
- Why do you think God chose to guide Israel with His presence rather than giving them a map and schedule? What does this reveal about God's character?

Read 2 Corinthians 4:17-18

· How does this perspective shift the way we view our current circumstances?

THIS WEEK'S APPLICATION:

The sermon mentions two types of promises to hold onto: the promise of eternity and the promises of right now.

Which one is harder for you to hold onto, and why?

Think about your current season of life.

• What "fog" are you facing right now? How might God be asking you to trust Him in this uncertainty?
