# STUDY QUESTIONS

## GETTING STARTED:

Share about a time when you were part of a team that accomplished something you couldn't have done alone. What made that experience memorable?

## A DEEPER DIVE:

### Read Nehemiah 3

- » How does the repeated phrase 'next to him and next to them' in Nehemiah 3 challenge the way you currently engage with fellow believers in your spiritual journey?
- » Why do you think Jesus chose to have different levels of community (crowds, 70-120 disciples, the 12, and the 3) rather than doing ministry alone or with just one group size?
- » What specific barriers prevent you from participating in smaller, more intimate community groups where confession, accountability, and deeper relationships can develop?
- » What does it mean practically that 'we cannot follow Jesus alone,' and how does this truth conflict with cultural messages about independence and self-reliance?
- » **Read I Corinthians 12:12-14, 25-27.** If you are a part of the body of Christ what specific function do you see yourself contributing to the body?
- » What are some things that tend to divide us? How can we be uniters rather than dividers?
