1. What Would He Look Like?

- 1. Who has believed our report? And to whom has the arm of the LORD been revealed?
- 2. For He shall grow up before Him as a tender plant, And as a root out of dry ground. He has no form or comeliness; And when we see Him, There is no beauty that we should desire Him.

- 3. He was despised and rejected by mankind, a man of suffering, and familiar with pain. Like one from whom people hide their faces he was despised, and we held him in low esteem.
- 4. Surely he took up our pain and bore our suffering, yet we considered him punished by God, stricken by him, and afflicted.
