- 1. A commitment to the Lord Jesus Christ
- 2. A commitment to your spouse
- 3. A commitment to your family
- 4. A commitment to others

Warning from Judges 2:10 - All that generation also were gathered to their fathers; and there arose another generation after them who did not know the LORD, nor yet the work which He had done for Israel.

- Primary Purpose for all Believers Glorify God
 1 Cor 10:31 Whether, then, you eat or drink or whatever you do, do all to the glory of God.

God's Holy Word

- 2 Peter 1:2-4 "...He has granted to us everything pertaining to life and godliness..."
- Psalm 19:7-9
- 2 Timothy 3:16-17 Scripture equips us for "every good work"

Primary Resources for Godly Parenting

The Holy Spirit

- Philippians 2:13 "for it is God who is at work in you, both to will and to work for His good pleasure"
- 1 Corinthians 2:14 "But a natural man does not accept the things of the Spirit of God; for they are foolishness to him, and he cannot understand them, because they are spiritually appraised."

Primary Resources for Godly Parenting

Godly Parents

Husbands who follow God's design for the family

Primary Provider and Leader

1 Corinthians 11:3; 1 Timothy 5:8

Wives who follow God's design for the family

Priority to Home and Family

Titus 2:4-5; Proverbs 31:12-27

- "Observance of all the principles we are learning will produce the most effective results when they are practiced in a home that follows God's design for the family"
- Our ultimate ambition as a believer is to glorify God
 2 Cor 5:9 Therefore we also have as our ambition, whether at home or absent, to be pleasing to Him.

- What is the goal of parenting?
- TO BE A FAITHFUL INSTRUMENT IN GOD'S HANDS FOR ACTIVELY BRINGING UP MY CHILD ACCORDING TO BILBICAL PRINCIPLES
- To be a Faithful Instrument or Steward
- We'll look at Two Biblical Principles
 God's View of Man
 God's Directions for Parents

- 1. Man is NOT inherently good
- How does the world view man's nature?

The natural man's goal is to *feel good about himself* and thus function better.

- 1. Man is inherently evil
- ☐ Clear biblical evidence that everyone is a sinner
 - Romans 3:10-11, "as it is written, THERE IS NONE RIGHTEOUS, NOT EVEN ONE; THERE IS NONE WHO UNDERSTANDS, THERE IS NONE WHO SEEKS FOR GOD."

- 1. Man is inherently evil
- ☐ Sin affects the whole human:
 - \Box The Will Ephesians 2:1-3; 2 Peter 2:18-19
 - □ The Mind and Understanding Romans 8:7; Ephesians 4:17-18

- 1. Man is inherently evil
- Sin affects the whole human:
 - \Box The affections and emotions -2 Timothy 3:3-4
 - □ Outward speech and behavior Mark 7:21-23; Galatians 5:19-21; James 3:5-9

- 1. Man is inherently evil
- ☐ This is the doctrine of Total Depravity

Not all sinners are equally evil, but all are utterly unable to rid themselves of the guilt of sin and establish an eternal relationship with God.

- Man is inherently evil Totally Depraved
- It is in this sinful condition that a child enters the world
 - □ Psalm 58:3; Psalm 51:5
- No amount of "good" behavior can ever make us perfect and able to stand before God Isaiah 64:6
- Every child is wholly fallen and wholly in need of redemption
- Scripture teaches that the heart is the control center for life
 - Genesis 8:21; Proverbs 4:23; Turn to Page 107 in your books

- Man is inherently evil Totally Depraved
- Issue is...parenting is primarily internal, dealing with the heart — Understanding sin before Holy God
- Parenting must focus on Christ
 - ☐ For our children's salvation
 - ☐ For our children's progressive sanctification

Ephesians 6:4, "And, fathers, do not provoke your children to anger; but bring them up in the discipline and instruction of the Lord"

- 1. The Essence of God's Directions
- lacksquare "bring them up"
 - ACTIVE not passive
- What does passive parenting look like?
 - Lacks wisdom; fails to study God's word; fails to pray as instructed (Prov 1:1-7; James 1:5
 - Excuses our children's sin
- How do we become passive in our parenting?

- 1. The Essence of God's Directions
- lacksquare "bring them up"
 - ACTIVE not passive
- How do we become passive in our parenting?
- Consider David's example Great king, military man, musician,
 Poor Father
 - □ 2 Samuel 13:1-39; 2 Samuel 15-19; 1 Kings 1:5-31
 - ☐ Where did it start though? 2 Samuel 11:1

- 1. The Essence of God's Directions
- "bring them up"
- We must actively pursue the task of bringing up our children
 - Particularly Dad Why?

- 1. The Essence of God's Directions
- "bring them up" Actively
- Particularly Dad
 - □ Dads are directly accountable to God due to His structure of headship 1 Cor 11:1-3; 1 Tim 3
 - "Be imitators of me, just as I also am of Christ. Now I praise you because you remember me in everything and hold firmly to the traditions, just as I delivered them to you. But I want you to understand that Christ is the head of every man, and the man is the head of a woman, and God is the head of Christ. "

- 1. The Essence of God's Directions
- "bring them up" Actively
- Particularly Dad
 - Dads can be tempted to think their work is done when they arrive home
 - □ Dads we need a reminder when we come home "YOU ARE NOW ENTERING THE MISSION FIELD"

- 1. The Essence of God's Directions
- "bring them up" CONTINUOUSLY
- Parenting is Work
 - Parenting is Striving (Deut 6:4-9)
 - □ Parenting is NOT passive neglecting (Prov 24:30-34)

- 1. The Essence of God's Directions
- "bring them up" COMMANDED
- Parenting according to God's design is not optional
- We are to bring them up Actively, Continuously, and with Authority

- 2. The Execution of God's Directions
- Discipline general heading of Training
 - Methods: Rules, Guidelines, Restrictions, Rewards, Correction, and Structure
 - Proverbs 24:3-4 "By wisdom a house is built, And by understanding it is established; And by knowledge the rooms are filled With all precious and pleasant riches."

- 2. The Execution of God's Directions
- Discipline general heading of Training
 - Methods: Rules, Guidelines, Restrictions, Rewards, Correction, and Structure
 - In submission to this training is where children learn obedience to authority
 - Col 3:20 Children, be obedient to your parents in all things, for this is well-pleasing to the Lord.

- 2. The Execution of God's Directions
- Discipline general heading of Training
 - OF SHAPING A CHILD'S BEHAVIOR. IT IS ALSO A MEASN BY WHICH A PARENT POINTS A CHILD TO HIS NEED FOR CHRIST. WHEN A CHILD FAILS TO LIVE UP TO THE STANDRDS WHICH HE IS TAUGHT, IT IS AN OPPORTUNITY TO EXPLAIN HIS NEED FOR A SAVIOR

- 2. The Execution of God's Directions
- Discipline general heading of Training
 - Note on Correction: chastisement for wrongdoing teaches sowing and reaping principle
 - ☐ Includes use of 'the rod' but is not limited to it
 - Look up: Prov 13:24; 19:18; 22:15, 23:13-14; 29:15, 29:17
 - Using the rod in a biblical, loving manner proves you love your child

- 2. The Execution of God's Directions
- Discipline general heading of Training
 - Note on Correction: chastisement for wrongdoing teaches sowing and reaping principle
 - But to be a biblical parent…to do it God's way…we must be willing to trust God's Word and be obedient in this area.

- 2. The Execution of God's Directions
- ☐ Instruction "putting into the mind"
 - Methods: teaching, verbal admonition, encouragement, advice, and warning
 - ☐ Topics:
 - Character and Deeds of God
 - ☐ God's requirements of us

- 2. The Execution of God's Directions
- ☐ Instruction "putting into the mind"
 - Balance between Discipline and Instruction
 - ☐ Pg 112 in Appendix

- 3. Summary
- ☐ The Parent's Goal glorify God in our parenting as faithful stewards of the blessing of children
- ☐ How? Actively Discipline/Train and Instruct
- □ Why? We Discipline and Instruct not merely for Behaviors, but so our children know God and their hearts before Him
