

From this Greek term we derive 'exegesis': we might almost say that Jesus is the exegesis of God. Elsewhere in the New Testament the verb means 'to tell a narrative' or 'to narrate' (Lk. 24:35; Acts 10:8; 15:12, 14; 21:19). In that sense we might say that Jesus is the narration of God
