

Matthew 23:12

O believer, learn to reject pride, seeing that you have no ground for it. Whatever you are, you have nothing to make you arrogant. The more you have, the more you are in debt to God; and you should not be proud of that which makes you a debtor. Consider your origin; look back to what you once were. Consider what you would have been but for divine grace.

Therefore, be not proud, though you have many earthly treasures and temporal abilities you have not one single thing to call your own except your sin and misery. Oh! strange infatuation, that you, who have borrowed everything from God, should think of exalting yourself; a poor dependent beggar in need of the bounty of thy Savior. Your very life this moment would cease apart from fresh streams of life from Jesus every second of the day, and yet you are proud! O silly heart!

QUESTIONS on the sin of pride?

Group Discussion:

- Walk through the self-examination list. After personally affirming one or more, discuss what Scriptures you can use to fight the battle of that specific temptation toward pride.
- 1. Do I think I'm more spiritually mature than others in my life?
- 2. Am I able to humbly learn from others, especially those who are less educated or experienced than me?
- 3. Do I quickly find fault with others?
- 4. Do I frequently correct or criticize others?
- 5. Do I have a hard time admitting when I am wrong?
- 6. Am I controlling—of my spouse, my children, friends, those in my workplace?
- 7. Do I neglect genuine, heartfelt prayer, worship, and time in the Word?
- 8. Do I get easily hurt if my accomplishments or service is not recognized or rewarded?
- 9. Is it hard for me to let others know when I'm in need of help (practically or spiritually)?
- 10. Am I only thinking how many of these questions apply to someone I know... ...feeling pretty good that none of these things really apply to me?
