THEME: The soul that would praise God is the soul that must remember and rehearse His goodness.

1. The Commands for personal praise (vs. 1 & 2)

1 Samuel 30:6

⁶Moreover David was greatly distressed because the people spoke of stoning him, for all the people were embittered, each one because of his sons and his daughters. **But David strengthened himself in the LORD his God.**

The Psalmist's Method for Worship:

"forget none of His benefits", REMEMBER

- 2. The Keys for personal praise > (Pondering our benefits in Christ) (vs. 3-5)
 - a. Complete Pardoning (Benefit #1)

v.3a - "Who pardons all your iniquities"

vs. 4a – "who redeems your life from the pit"

DEFINITION

Redemption refers supremely to the work of Christ on our behalf, whereby he purchases us (Acts 20:28), he ransoms us at the price of his own life, securing our deliverance from the bondage and condemnation of sin.

 - d. Complete Reward (Benefit #4)

vs. 4b – "who crowns you with lovingkindness and compassion"

2 Reasons why we are crowned this way

- 1. We would not be able to keep our salvation on our own and so He crowns us with His loyal, unchanging love (Rom. 8).
- 2. We feel our unworthiness of such love and so He also crowns us with compassion that is, He deals with us tenderly/mercifully.

 - d. Complete Reward (Benefit #4)
 - e. Complete Satisfaction & Renewal (Benefit #5)

Hinderances for personal praise:

- Neglect of His Word
- Neglect of prayer
- Trials not submitted to the Lord
- Remaining in despair
- Hidden and unconfessed sin (idols, immorality)
- Bitterness toward family or friends

- Unforgiveness: Holding grudges and past hurts
- Cynicism
- Worrying (health, finances, job, marriage, children)
- Selfishness
- Hypocrisy
- Praying with the wrong motives
- Unbelief
