 - 1 Peter 4:11 "Whoever speaks, [is to do so] as one who is speaking the utterances of God; whoever serves [is to do so] as one who is serving by the strength which God supplies; so that in all things God may be glorified through Jesus Christ, to whom belongs the glory and dominion forever and ever. Amen."

 - Spiritual Discernment (1 Cor 12:10)

I. Healing and Miracles

- 1. Purpose
 - To confirm the gospel message
 - Hebrews 2:3-4 How will we escape if we neglect so great a salvation? After it was at the first spoken through the Lord, it was confirmed to us by those who heard, God also testifying with them, both by signs and wonders and by various miracles and by gifts of the Holy Spirit according to His own will.

I. Healing and Miracles

- 1. Purpose
 - To confirm the gospel message (Hebrews 2:3-4)
 - To confirm the apostles
 - Acts 5:12 At the hands of the apostles many signs and wonders were taking place among the people; and they were all with one accord in Solomon's portico.
 - 2 Corinthians 12:12 The signs of a true apostle were performed among you with all perseverance, by signs and wonders and miracles.
 - Romans 15:18-19 For I will not presume to speak of anything except what Christ has accomplished through me, resulting in the obedience of the Gentiles by word and deed, in the power of signs and wonders, in the power of the Spirit; so that from Jerusalem and round about as far as Illyricum I have fully preached the gospel of Christ.

- I. Healing and Miracles
 - 1. Purpose
 - To confirm the gospel message (Hebrews 2:3-4)
 - To confirm the apostles (Acts 5:12; 2 Cor. 12:12; Rom. 15:18-19)
 - Their discontinuation
 - No longer needed
 - The passing of the apostles

I. Healing and Miracles

II. Tongues and the interpretation of tongues

- 1. Tongues involved the proclamation of God's word in known languages unknown to the speaker (Acts 2:4-11)
 - Their purpose
 - A sign to unbelieving Jews (1 Corinthians 14:21-22)
 - Attested to the salvation of the Gentiles and new people groups (Acts 10:47; 11:15-18; 19:1-7)
 - For prophetic utterance (1 Corinthians 14:26-28)
 - Their discontinuation
 - The attestation to Gentile inclusion no longer needed
 - The sufficiency of Scripture precludes need for new prophecy

III. The Exercise of Spiritual Gifts

- I. Be involved in ministry
- **II. Find your giftedness**
- III. Minister your gift in love



IV. Application

- Every Christian has been uniquely gifted by God for ministry
- We received our giftedness at salvation
- Our giftedness is a blend of various spiritual gifts
- We are exhorted to employ our gifts in serving others for the purpose of building up the body of Christ
- Our gifts are useless if not exercised in love
- If we do not exercise our giftedness, the growth of the church will be hindered

 - Wisdom (James 1:5)
 - Knowledge (2 Tim. 2:15)
 - Exhortation (Hebrews 10:25)
 - Giving (2 Co. 9:7)
