Genesis 1:1 (NASB95)

1 In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth.

A. GOD IS CREATOR AND OWNER OF EVERYTHING.

Isaiah 44:24 (NASB95)

- **24** Thus says the Lord, your Redeemer, and the one who formed you from the womb, “I, the Lord, am the maker of all things, Stretching out the heavens by Myself And spreading out the earth all alone,

Revelation 4:11 (NASB95)

- **11** “Worthy are You, our Lord and our God, to receive glory and honor and power; for You created all things, and because of Your will they existed, and were created.”

Psalm 24:1–2 (NASB95)

- **1** The earth is the Lord's, and all it contains, The world, and those who dwell in it.
- **2** For He has founded it upon the seas And established it upon the rivers.

Psalm 50:10–12 (NASB95)

- 10 “For every beast of the forest is Mine, The cattle on a thousand hills.
- 11 “I know every bird of the mountains, And everything that moves in the field is Mine.
- 12 “If I were hungry I would not tell you, For the world is Mine, and all it contains.

ILLUSTRATION

Romans 9:20–21 (NASB95)

- **20** On the contrary, who are you, O man, who answers back to God? The thing molded will not say to the molder, “Why did you make me like this,” will it?
- **21** Or does not the potter have a right over the clay, to make from the same lump one vessel for honorable use and another for common use?

1. THE PERSON OF GOD REVEALED IN CREATION.

Romans 1:18–20 (NASB95)

- **18** For the wrath of God is revealed from heaven against all ungodliness and unrighteousness of men who suppress the truth in unrighteousness,
- **19** because that which is known about God is evident within them; for God made it evident to them.

1. THE PERSON OF GOD REVEALED IN CREATION.

Romans 1:18–20 (NASB95)

- **20** For since the creation of the world His invisible attributes, His eternal power and divine nature, have been clearly seen, being understood through what has been made, so that they are without excuse.

ETERNAL POWER

Colossians 1:16–17 (NASB95)

- **16** For by Him all things were created, both in the heavens and on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or rulers or authorities—all things have been created through Him and for Him.
- **17** He is before all things, and in Him all things hold together.

DIVINE NATURE

Matthew 5:45 (NASB95)

- 45 so that you may be sons of your Father who is in heaven; for He causes His sun to rise on the evil and the good, and sends rain on the righteous and the unrighteous.

2. THE LAW OF GOD IN THE CONSCIENCE.

Romans 2:14–15 (NASB95)

- 14 For when Gentiles who do not have the Law do instinctively the things of the Law, these, not having the Law, are a law to themselves,
- 15 in that they show the work of the Law written in their hearts, their conscience bearing witness and their thoughts alternately accusing or else defending them,

- The conscience is an alarm system.

-
- The conscience activates based on the level of good that is known.

-
- The conscience can be programmed.

ILLUSTRATION

Genesis 4:9 (NASB95)

- Then the Lord said to Cain, “Where is Abel your brother?” And he said, “I do not know. Am I my brother’s keeper?”

ILLUSTRATION

Genesis 27:12 (NASB95)

- “Perhaps my father will feel me, then I will be as a deceiver in his sight, and I will bring upon myself a curse and not a blessing.”

ILLUSTRATION

Genesis 39:10 (NASB95)

- As she spoke to Joseph day after day, he did not listen to her to lie beside her or be with her.

B. GOD IS PERFECTLY HOLY.

1 John 1:5 (NASB95)

- This is the message we have heard from Him and announce to you, that God is Light, and in Him there is no darkness at all.

B. GOD IS PERFECTLY HOLY.

Matthew 5:48 (NASB95)

- “Therefore you are to be perfect, as your heavenly Father is perfect.

C. GOD REQUIRES PERFECT OBEDIENCE TO HIS
LAW.

James 2:10 (NASB95)

- For whoever keeps the whole law and yet stumbles in one point, he has become guilty of all.

II. MAN



A. EVERYONE HAS BROKEN GOD'S LAW.

Definition of Sin: Sin is disobedience against God. It is refusing to do what he commands and insisting on doing what He forbids. Sin is fundamentally a matter of worship.

A. EVERYONE HAS BROKEN GOD'S LAW.

Romans 3:10–11 (NASB95)

- **10** as it is written, “There is none righteous, not even one;
- **11** There is none who understands, There is none who seeks for God;

Romans 3:23 (NASB95)

- **23** for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God,

A. EVERYONE HAS BROKEN GOD'S LAW.

Ecclesiastes 7:20 (NASB95)

- Indeed, there is not a righteous man on earth who continually does good and who never sins.

A. EVERYONE HAS BROKEN GOD'S LAW.

Isaiah 53:6 (NASB95)

- All of us like sheep have gone astray, Each of us has turned to his own way; But the Lord has caused the iniquity of us all To fall on Him.

A. EVERYONE HAS BROKEN GOD'S LAW.

Psalm 14:1 (NASB95)

- The fool has said in his heart, “There is no God.” They are corrupt, they have committed abominable deeds; There is no one who does good.

**B. THE CONSEQUENCE FOR SIN IS SEPARATION
FROM GOD.**

Isaiah 59:1–2 (NASB95)

- **1** Behold, the Lord's hand is not so short That it cannot save; Nor is His ear so dull That it cannot hear.
- **2** But your iniquities have made a separation between you and your God, And your sins have hidden His face from you so that He does not hear.

**B. THE CONSEQUENCE FOR SIN IS SEPARATION
FROM GOD.**

Romans 6:23 (NASB95)

- For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord.

C. GOOD WORKS AND GOOD INTENTIONS CANNOT
SAVE ANYONE.

Titus 3:5 (NASB95)

- He saved us, not on the basis of deeds which we have done in righteousness, but according to His mercy, by the washing of regeneration and renewing by the Holy Spirit,

Ephesians 2:8–9 (NASB95)

- **8** For by grace you have been saved through faith; and that not of yourselves, it is the gift of God;
- **9** not as a result of works, so that no one may boast.
