OLD VS NEW

Old Wine Skins= Old Mindsets

- Rigid traditions
- •"We've always done it this way" thinking
- Familiarity
- Comfort
- Fear of change
- •Arrogance ("Our way is the only right way")
- •Past success (the biggest enemy of future success)

New Wineskins= Open Mindsets

- Openness
- Curiosity
- Creativity
- Humility
- •Willingness to experiment
- •A learner's posture

Why Openness is Essential

What Happens when:

- •People change ministry must adjust.
- •Culture shifts communication shifts.
- •Technology advances engagement advances.
- •Different generations respond differently.
- •Relevance requires revelation plus creativity.
- •Closed minds always create closed ministries.

Signs of Old Wineskins

- •"That won't work here."
- •"We tried that once."
- "Our church isn't used to that."
- No experimentation, no innovation.
- •Presentations feel predictable, stale, repetitive.
- No new leaders emerging.
- •Ministry becomes maintenance instead of mission.

Jesus' Warning

According to Matthew 9:17

If you don't update the wineskin, you lose both:

You lose the new wine (fresh potential)

You lose the wineskin (existing structure collapses)

This is why openness is not optional — it's spiritual stewardship.
