Pillars

Genesis 28:18

1 Kings 7:15–22

Pillars are used in the Temple, symbolizing strength and stability.

Exodus 14:19–20

The pillar moves between Israel and the Egyptian army to protect them.


Migdol

1. The Hebrew word Migdol (מִגְדֹּל) means **"tower" or "fortress"** and can also refer to fortified land or an elevated stage. The name is derived from the Hebrew root for **"to grow" or "to become great"**. It appears in the Bible to name several locations in ancient Egypt, including a frontier fortress and a site where the Israelites camped before crossing the Red Sea.
- Location: In the Exodus narrative, the Israelite camp is situated between Migdol and the Sea of Reeds (also known as the Red Sea) before they crossed it.
 - Significance: This Migdol was likely a prominent watchtower or fort on the eastern edge of Egypt's Delta. It served as a landmark to define the Israelite camp's position.

- **How does this show that God's plans may not always make sense to us?**






Pharaoh's Pursuit (Exodus 14:5–9)

Pharaoh regrets letting Israel go and sends his army.

- **How do we respond when past troubles seem to chase us?**





Israel's Fear and Complaint (Exodus 14:10–12)

Key Point: The people panic and question Moses.


- **What does fear do to our faith?**
- **Have you ever felt like God led you into a trap?**





Salvation

- Hebrew, "salvation" is derived from the root word yasha (which means to rescue, save, or deliver from danger, oppression, or sin.
- The noun form, yeshuah (carries the meaning of deliverance, rescue, safety, and well-being.
- In the biblical context, this encompasses both physical deliverance (like from enemies) and spiritual salvation, which brings eternal life and rescue from God's wrath





Moses' Response and God's Promise (Exodus 14:13–14)

“The Lord will fight for you; you need only to be still.”


Deliverance from Sin and Wrath	primary focus is on being saved from the guilt and destructive power of sin, as well as from the just punishment of God's wrath that results from it.	Romans 5:9: "Since we have now been justified by his blood, how much more shall we be saved from God's wrath through him!"
The Role of Jesus Christ	His death on the cross atones for human sins, and his resurrection overcomes death.	Jhn 3:16 "For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life."
God's Grace	Salvation is not earned by good works but is a gracious, unmerited gift from God to those who trust in Christ.	John 10:28 "I give them eternal life, and they shall never perish; no one will snatch them out of my hand."
Faith and Trust	To receive salvation, one must place their faith and trust in Jesus and his finished work.	Jhn 5:11 "And this is the testimony: God has given us eternal life, and this life is in his Son. Whoever has the Son has life; whoever does not have the Son of God does not have life."
The Gift of Eternal Life	Salvation culminates in eternal life and restored fellowship with God, transforming believers and enabling them to live according to God's purposes.	Titus 3:7 "So that, having been justified by his grace, we might become heirs having the hope of eternal life."





3 C's of Salvation

Conviction	The Holy Spirit's awareness of one's sinfulness.
Confession	The verbal declaration of faith in Christ and acknowledgment of guilt.
Conversion	The subsequent act of turning from sin and fully following Christ.






The Miracle at the Sea (Exodus 14:15–22)

God parts the Red Sea; Israel walks through on dry ground.

- **What does this miracle teach us about God's power?**
- **How does obedience play a role in experiencing God's deliverance?**





The Defeat of Egypt (Exodus 14:23–31)

The Egyptian army is destroyed; Israel sees God's glory.

- **How does this event shape Israel's view of God?**
- **What victories has God brought in your life that strengthened your faith?**
