Today, we're taking a break from our sermon series in the book of Acts – "The Original Church Planter" – and I will have a conversation with Dr. Logan on the topic of Church Planting.

We have been working for about 2 years toward the goal of planting a church.

5) For those who don't sense God leading them to be part of the plant, how can they help support the plant? What can they do now to support the plant?

6) What am I not asking you – that I should be asking you about the church plant process?

Matthew 28:18-20 (NLT)

Jesus came and told His disciples, "I have been given all authority in heaven and on earth.

<u>Therefore, go and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the</u> name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit.

Teach these new disciples to obey all the commands I have given you. And be sure of this: I am with you always, even to the end of the age."

Acts 1:8 (NLT)

"But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you. And you will be My witnesses, telling people about Me everywhere—in Jerusalem, throughout Judea, in Samaria, and to the ends of the earth."

Matthew 9:35-38 (NLT)

Jesus traveled through all the towns and villages of that area, teaching in the synagogues and announcing the Good News about the Kingdom. And He healed every kind of disease and illness.

When He saw the crowds, He had compassion on them because they were confused and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd.

He said to His disciples, "The harvest is great, but the workers are few. So pray to the Lord who is in charge of the harvest; ask Him to send more workers into His fields."

Acts 13:1-3 (NLT)

Among the prophets and teachers of the church at Antioch of Syria were Barnabas, Simeon (called "the black man"), Lucius (from Cyrene), Manaen (the childhood companion of King Herod Antipas), and Saul.

One day as these men were worshiping the Lord and fasting, the Holy Spirit said, "Dedicate Barnabas and Saul for the special work to which I have called them."

So after more fasting and prayer, the men laid their hands on them and sent them on their way.

Revelation 7:9-10 (NLT)

After this I saw a vast crowd, too great to count, from every nation and tribe and people and language, standing in front of the throne and before the Lamb. They were clothed in white robes and held palm branches in their hands.

And they were shouting with a great roar, "Salvation comes from our God who sits on the throne and from the Lamb!"
