What is a king and what does he do?

The king was the central ruler of the nation. He was responsible to keep the **peace**, administer **justice**, uphold the **law**, and centralize the **power**. Biblical kings were called to recognize God as King (Ex.15:18) and that their rule *over* Israel was *under* God.



23 King Solomon was greater in riches and wisdom than all the other kings of the earth. 24 The whole world sought audience with Solomon to hear the wisdom God had put in his heart. 25 Year after year, everyone who came brought a gift—articles of silver and gold, robes, weapons and spices, and horses and mules.

SOLOMON CHOSE WISDOM FROM GOD

SOLOMON ENDED IN SPIRITUAL INFIDELITY

4 In Solomon's old age, they [his many foreign wives] turned his heart to worship other gods instead of being completely faithful to the Lord his God, as his father, David, had been. 5 Solomon worshiped Ashtoreth, the goddess of the Sidonians, and Molech, the detestable god of the Ammonites. 6 In this way, Solomon did what was evil in the Lord's sight; he refused to follow the Lord completely, as his father, David, had done.
