Incredible ways to **HIDE** God's word in our hearts

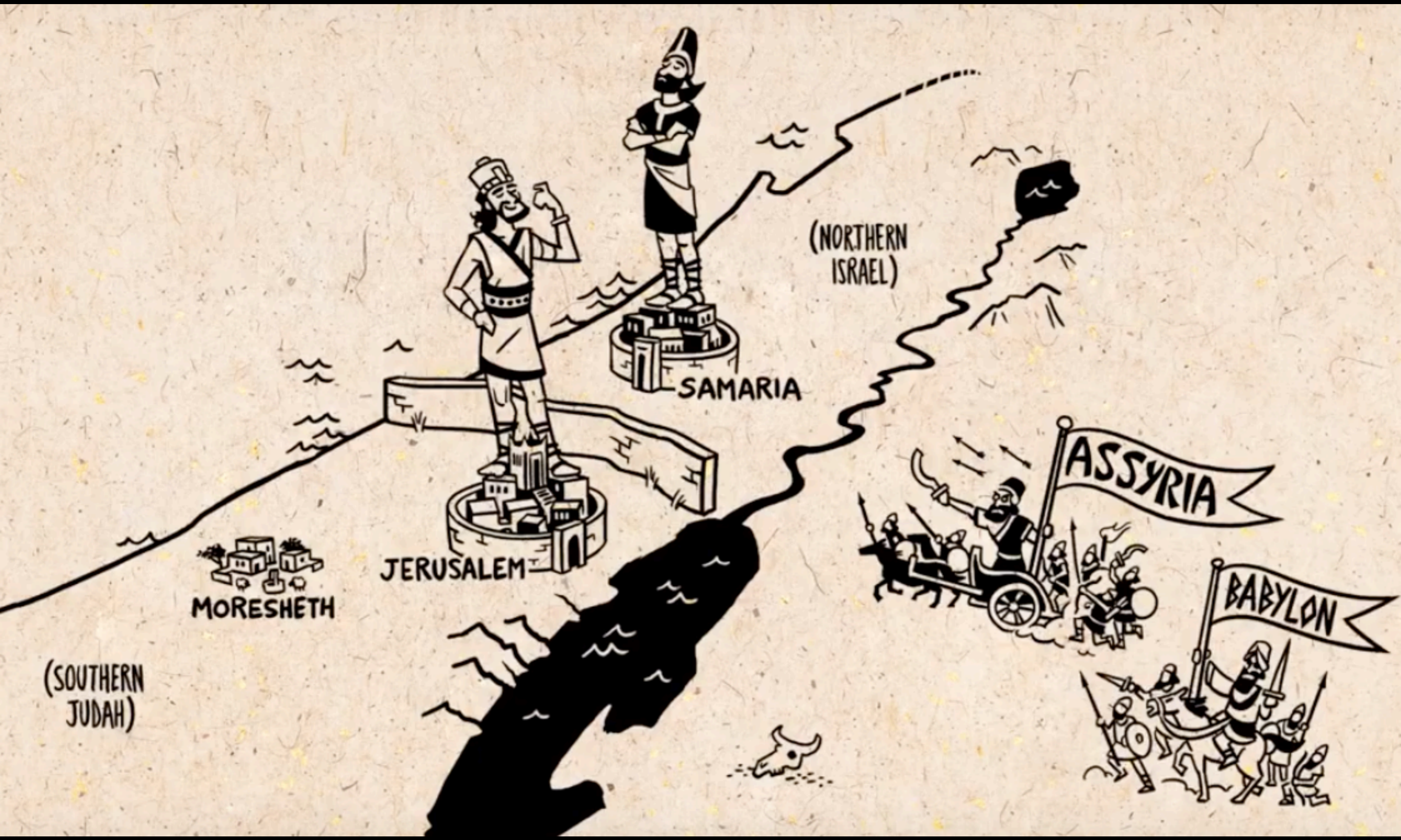
ACTIVE & DYNAMIC and often find *us*
