They were teaching that Jesus Christ was not sufficient, that He was not unique... that they needed to be taught additional philosophies, to worship elements of the universe, be imposed with circumcision, and to worship angels. . . Paul warned that false teachers would carry you off as spoil, like slave-dealers carrying away the people into slavery."
