Preparing for the Study

1. Begin with prayer. You are about to read the words of God. You never want to take it lightly. You need the Holy Spirit to help you understand, so **Pray** first! (**2 Timothy 3:16, 2 Peter 1:20-21**)
2. Read **Genesis Chapter 1-2**

Observations

1. In the Appendix go through Genesis 1. Do the following as you read.
 - a. **Underline** in green the phrase: "**there was evening and there was morning, _____ day**" (Gen 1:5, 8, 13, 19, 23 and 31)
 - b. **Underline** in red the phrase: "**God say that it was good**" (Gen 1:4, 10, 12, 18, 21, 25, and 31)
 - c. In the margins in the appendix by the appropriate day of creation, list the day and what was created on that day.
2. Who was there in the beginning of time? Record what you find
 - a. **Genesis 1:1-2**
 - b. **John 1:1-3**
 - c. **John 1:14**
 - d. **Colossians 1:13-17**
 - e. **Proverbs 8:22-31** (Clue is the context **Proverbs 1:12**)
 - f. **1 Corinthians 1:24**
3. Read Genesis 2 and answer the following questions.
 - a. Using **Genesis 2:2-3** what did God do on the seventh day and why?
 - b. Based on **Genesis 2:7** how was man formed?
 - c. Where did God put the man and what did He tell him to do? **Gen 2:15**
 - d. What was God's first command given to the man? What could he do and how could he do it? (**Gen 2:16**)

- e. What was he told not to do? What were the consequences if he didn't obey? **(Gen 2:17)**
- f. What did God say was not good in **Gen 2:18**?
- g. How was the women created? **(Gen 2:21-22)**

Let's think a little deeper

1. Let's spend some time considering the implications of God creating everything (including us). How should that affect our lives? **(Romans 1:20-21)**
2. Since He is the Creator, shouldn't He know the best path to walk? What can you do to gain His wisdom and insight? **(Proverbs 2:1-6)** Are you acting on this Truth? How do you need to change? What are the implications if you don't change considering God being the Creator?
3. Since He is the Creator and we are his workmanship, how does that thought affect the way we should approach Him? **(Isaiah 46:8-10)**
4. Considering all you have seen this week, write out a prayer to the Creator of the Universe.
