1. Begin with prayer. Then read Romans 12-13

Observations

- 1. Considering all we have studied so far (Romans 1-11) Paul tells us how to work out our salvation. Based of Romans 12:1-2 how and what are we to do?
- 2. Just in case you missed it, how are we to not be conformed to this world and be transformed?
- 3. Using Romans 12:3 what are we to not think? What ought we to think?
- 4. Paul uses the example of the church in verses 4-8. What do you think is the main point Paul is trying to make?
- 5. Using Romans 12:9-16 List what work the Lord wants us to do. Are you being a gift to the church? How can you grow in this? Is this what every believer is called to do?
- 6. In Romans 12:17-21 summarize how we are to treat evil in this world. Use 1 Peter 3:9-12 to understand this more.
- 7. Romans 13:1-2 where does government and all authority come from and how are we to respond to it?
- 8. We should be fearful of authority if we do evil. (Romans 13:3-7) But what other reason should we subject ourselves to their authority? Romans 13:5
- 9. Look up 1 Peter 2:18-20 as a cross reference. What is the motivation to submit in those verses? Does this help give you a different perspective?
- 10.Based on Romans 13:8-10 what is the fulfillment of the law that we owe everyone?
- 11. What are we to know and keep in mind to help us submit to authority and love everyone? Romans 13:11-13

- 12.Romans 13:14 commands us to put on the Lord Jesus Christ and make no provision for the flesh. What practically can you do to obey this command?
- 13. How does the thought that the time of salvation is near (Romans 13:11-12) help practically for you to obey what our Lord and Master is calling you to do?
